Please find attached, the Syllabus Guidelines for Directed Research and Teaching Apprenticeship Courses, which have been developed by the Graduate Council.

The guidelines are intended to aid faculty in developing syllabi for any directed research and teaching apprenticeship courses for which they serve as the instructor of record. The guidelines highlight the role of instructors to define the academic expectations for each course and underscore the importance of open and transparent communication throughout the course, beginning with the syllabus, to minimize confusion between a student's academic commitments and their employment obligations. The guidelines were developed to supplement the Systemwide Senate's Coordinating Committee of Graduate Affairs (CCGA) guidance (also attached), and reviewed by Labor Relations and the Division of Graduate Education and Postdoctoral Affairs (GEPA), and shared with the Academic Senate's Educational Policy Committee and Senate Council.
